WHAT THE JOB INVOLVES: Emergency Medical Specialists - Paramedics under general supervision, perform tasks such as the following: provide timely, professional pre-hospital emergency medical care/Basic Life Support (BLS) and Advanced Life Support (ALS) to anyone who requests/requires it; provide transportation to the appropriate medical facility; operate department vehicles; assist with on-line medical control; coordinate and direct pre-hospital care resources and operations in the event of a disaster; and provide patient care under the authorization of the Medical Director. All work is performed in accordance with FDNY policies and procedures and as legislatively prescribed in the requisite curriculum and allowed by Federal/New York State/Regional Protocols and in accordance with the level of training, New York State designated scope of practice and New York State and Regional BLS and ALS Protocols. EMS - Paramedics also prepare and submit reports as required, and may be assigned to work in any FDNY facility, as needed. All personnel perform related work.

Some of the physical activities performed by Emergency Medical Specialists - Paramedics and the environmental conditions experienced are: working outdoors in all kinds of weather; climbing stairs; using such devices as stair chair or ambulance stretcher; carrying equipment and patients on ambulance stretchers; treating patients who may have infectious and communicable diseases; working for extended periods during the day or night in ambulances; driving an ambulance in all kinds of weather; working in confined spaces such as under vehicles, trains, and buildings; working at hazardous material scenes such as a chemical spill or an industrial fire or accident; treating patients at heights such as rooftops, bridges or elevated highways; and reading a Mobile Data Terminal for call information and instructions in varying light conditions.

(This is a brief description of what you might do in this position and does not include all the duties of this position.)

THE SALARY: The current minimum salary is \$43,690 per annum. This rate is subject to change.

HOW TO APPLY: If you believe you are eligible to take this examination, submit an application on the Online Application System (OASys) at www.nyc.gov/examsforjobs. Follow the onscreen application instructions for electronically submitting your application and payment, and completing any required information. A valid email address is required to file online. Several internet service providers, including but not limited to Google, Yahoo!, Hotmail, and AOL, offer free email addresses. The following methods of payment are acceptable: major credit card, bank card associated with a bank account, or a prepaid debit card with a credit card logo which you may purchase online or at various retail outlets. If you pay online by credit card, bank card, or debit card, you will receive a \$5.00 discount. You may come to the DCAS Computerized Testing Centers to file for this examination online and submit a money order payable to DCAS (Exams).

Special Circumstances Guide: This guide is located on the DCAS website at www.nyc.gov/html/dcas/downloads/pdf/misc/exam_special_circumstances.pdf and available at the DCAS Computerized Testing Centers. This guide gives important information about claiming Veterans' or Legacy credit, and notifying DCAS of a change in your mailing address. Follow all instructions on the Special Circumstances Guide that pertain to you when you complete your "Application for Examination."

ELIGIBILITY TO TAKE EXAMINATION: This examination is open to each employee of the New York City Fire Department who **on the last day of the application period:**

- (1) holds a permanent (not provisional) competitive appointment or appears on a Preferred List (see Note, below) for the title of Emergency Medical Specialist - EMT; and
- (2) is not otherwise ineligible.

(Note: A "Preferred List" is a civil service list which is only for certain former permanent incumbents of the eligible title who have rehiring rights.)

If you do not know if you are eligible, check with **your agency's personnel office**. You are responsible for determining whether or not you meet the eligibility requirements for this examination prior to submitting your application. If you are marked "Not Eligible," your application fee will not be refunded and you will not receive a score.

CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENTS: At the time of promotion, you are required to possess:

- (1) a valid NYS Department of Health EMT-Paramedic certification; and
- (2) a valid NYC REMAC (New York City Regional Emergency Medical Advisory Committee) certificate.

These certificates must be maintained for the duration of your employment. **You will be responsible for payment of any fees associated with the maintenance of certifications.**

REQUIREMENTS TO BE PROMOTED: At the time of promotion, eligible candidates in the title of Emergency Medical Specialist - EMT must meet the following qualification requirements:

Driver License Requirement: You must have a motor vehicle driver license valid in the State of New York at the time of promotion. This license must be maintained for the duration of your employment. Serious moving violations, license suspensions or accident record may disqualify you. Also, you must successfully complete the Emergency Vehicle Operations Course (EVOC) prior to the completion of one year in title.

Respirator Equipment Requirement: Because you must be able to wear a NIOSH-certified respirator, you are not permitted to have facial hair that interferes with the sealing surface of the respirator and the face or interferes with the valve function of the respirator.

ELIGIBILITY TO BE PROMOTED: In order to be eligible for promotion, you must have completed your probationary period in the eligible title as indicated in the above "Eligibility To Take Examination" section, and you must be permanently employed in the eligible title or your name must appear on a Preferred List for the eligible title at the time of promotion.

REQUIRED INFORMATION:

1. **Application for Examination: When you are applying online**, follow the online instructions.
2. **Education and Experience Test:** Fill out **Sections B and C**. This test must be filled out completely and in detail for you to receive your proper rating. Keep a copy of your completed Education and Experience Test for your records. **When you are applying online**, follow the online instructions.

Note: You must list the title of license or certificate, issued by, date issued, license number and expiration date of your EMT and REMAC certificates in "Section C - Licenses and Certificates" on your Education and Experience Test.

THE TEST: You will be given an experience test. Your score on this test will be used to determine your place on an eligible list. On the experience test you will receive a score of 70.000 points for meeting the eligibility requirements listed above. After these requirements are met, you will receive additional credit up to a maximum of 100.000 points on the following basis:

For full-time satisfactory paid experience in the NYC 911 system performing emergency medical service duties after obtaining, and while holding, a valid NYS Department of Health EMT - Paramedic certification and valid NYC REMAC (New York City Regional Emergency Medical Advisory Committee) certificate for:

For full- time satisfactory paid experience with a government-run ambulance system or with a volunteer or private ambulance company outside of the NYC 911 system performing emergency medical service duties after obtaining, and while holding, a valid NYS Department of Health EMT-Paramedic certification and valid NYC REMAC (New York City Regional Emergency Medical Advisory Committee) certificate for:

At least 1 year of experience

You will receive an additional:

5.000 points

For full-time satisfactory paid experience in the NYC 911 system performing emergency medical service duties after obtaining, and while holding, a valid NYS Department of Health EMT - Basic certification for:

At least 6 months but less than 1 year of experience

You will receive an additional:

2.500 points

At least 1 year but less than 2 years of experience

5.000 points

At least 2 years but less than 3 years of experience

10.000 points

3 or more years of experience

15.000 points

You will receive a maximum of one year of experience credit for each year you worked. If you have any of the above experience on a part-time basis, it will be credited according to the equivalent percent of full-time experience. Each year of experience will be credited under only one category which will be the highest appropriate category.

You must clearly specify in detail all of your relevant experience on your Education and Experience Test and submit it by the end of the filing period. You will not receive credit for experience which you obtain after the end of the filing period, nor will you be permitted to submit new or additional information about your experience once the filing period has ended.

Experience must be obtained by **the last day of the Application Period.**

THE TEST RESULTS: If you pass the experience test and are marked eligible, your name will be placed in final score order on an eligible list and you will be given a list number. You will be notified by mail of your test results. If you meet all requirements and conditions, you will be considered for promotion when your name is reached on the eligible list.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Application Receipt: You will be emailed a receipt immediately after you have applied for the examination. If you do not receive this receipt, contact this agency at OASys@dcas.nyc.gov. Include your social security number and the examination number and title in your email. You will be mailed an acknowledgment letter within three months of the last date of the application period. If you do not receive this item, write to this agency, Attention: Exam Support Group, 1 Centre Street, 14th Floor, New York, NY 10007 to request verification that your application was received. Include your social security number and the examination number and title in your request.

EMS Academy Assessment: As a condition of completing EMS Academy training, you must pass multiple-choice exams, quizzes, scenarios and New York State written and practical exams.

Note: If you are presently serving as a provisionally appointed EMS-Paramedic with the FDNY and have previously taken and passed the written and practical tests, you will not be required to complete the EMS Academy Assessment again.

Drug Screening Requirement: You will be subject to random drug screening throughout the duration of your career.

Medical and Psychological Assessment: Medical and psychological guidelines have been established for the position of Emergency Medical Specialist - Paramedic. You will be expected to continuously perform the essential functions of the position of Emergency Medical Specialist - Paramedic throughout your career, and may, therefore, be medically and psychologically tested periodically throughout your career. Where appropriate, a reasonable accommodation will be provided for a person with a disability to enable him or her to take these medical and psychological examinations and/or to perform the essential functions of the job.

PENALTY FOR MISREPRESENTATION: Any intentional misrepresentation on the application or examination may result in disqualification, even after promotion, and may result in criminal prosecution.

The General Examination Regulations of the Department of Citywide Administrative Services apply to this examination and are part of this Notice of Examination. They are posted and copies are available at nyc.gov/dcas and at the DCAS Computerized Testing Centers.
