Nathan Kalmanson Receives Isaac Liberman Public Service Award From Hundred Year Association of New York

On December 16, 2008, Associate Juvenile Counselor Nathan Kalmanson of the Court Services/Transportation Unit received the Isaac Liberman Public Service Award from the Hundred Year Association of New York. The Hundred Year Association of New York was founded in 1927 and is composed of more than 200 companies and non-profit organizations operating in New York City. The Association recognizes outstanding achievement and public service of career civil servants. The program is coordinated by the Department of Citywide Administrative Services.

Mr. Kalmanson was honored for his thirty-eight years of outstanding service to the City. In his day to day responsibilities, Nathan Kalmanson is responsible for ensuring that all youth in care arrive at their venues by scheduling transportation to and from the courts. On September 6, 2007, Mr. Kalmanson was among a group of heroic staff and emergency responders whose exceptional efforts in response to a critical vehicle fire kept Agency staff as well as youth in the Department's care from being severely injured. He was recognized for his actions with an award during a DJJ ceremony in October 2007.

Colleagues, family and friends turned out to recognize and celebrate Mr. Kalmanson's career and wish him continued success. DJJ Senior Personnel Analyst Edward Birch (who provided the photos) noted, "The Hundred Year Association Awards Ceremony was a very moving experience. It was rewarding to see Mayor Bloomberg and the Association make presentations to Mr. Kalmanson and the other honorees for their long and meritorious service to this city. Thirty-eight years of dealing with the troubled youth of our city is certainly a feat well worth the honor and recognition."
