Dear Prospective Proposer:

Pursuant to Section 3-03 (f) (2) of the Procurement Policy Board (PPB) Rules, the Department of Youth and Community Development (DYCD) is issuing **Addendum #1** to the Out-of-School Time Programs for Youth (OST) Request for Proposals (RFP) PIN # 26005OSTRFP.

A. CHANGES AND/OR ADDITIONS TO LANGUAGE IN THE OST RFP
(Note to Proposers: All revised language in the RFP is italicized and in bold.)

1. Section II: Overview of the Request for Proposals: On Page 10, the 1st paragraph is revised as follows:

Participation by Government Entities in this RFP

Government entities and their related affiliates, including but not limited to public libraries, public schools, and other City Agencies, are not eligible to receive a contract award under Service Options I, II, II, and IV. *In addition, while these entities may participate in OST programs through linkage agreements (for which no payment is received) with organizations awarded contracts from this RFP for Service Options I – IV and are encouraged to contribute in-kind resources, they are not permitted to participate as subcontractors to organizations awarded contracts from this RFP for Service Options I – IV.*

Proposers should note that government entities and their related affiliates continue to be eligible to receive a contract award under Service Option V and may also participate as a subcontractor to any organization awarded a contract under this RFP for Service Option V.

2. **Subcontracting:** On Page 10, new language regarding subcontracting is added to Section II, C. Service Options, as follows:

Subcontracting:

- *Subcontractors must meet the same minimum qualifications as prime contractors.*
- *All subcontractors and subcontracts shall be subject to DYCD approval before payment is issued.*
- *A prime contractor may not subcontract all program services nor allow program services to be performed by entities with which there is no DYCD-approved subcontract.*
- *Prime contractors and subcontractors for Service Options I, II, and III may additionally participate as subcontractors to an organization awarded a contract for Service Option IV.*

3. **OST Priority Middle Schools and SES Providers:** On Page 91, Appendix E is revised to provide additional language, as follows:

A proposer for a Priority Middle School who is also a State-approved Supplemental Educational Services (SES) provider may propose to provide both the OST component and the SES component of the services.

A proposer for a Priority Middle School may propose a linkage or partnership agreement with a State-approved SES provider that is a for-profit or not-for-profit entity.

4. **Sites Located Outside New York City:** Page 17, under “F – Program Facilities – Options I and II only” and Page 23, under “Program Facility,” are revised to provide additional language, as follows:

Under Options I and II, funding may be used to provide services at a summer sleep-away or day camp that is located outside New York City. However, such programs will only be credited with 10 hours per day of services toward meeting the minimum daily hourly requirements and must meet the minimum program duration requirements of Options I and II. There will be no change in the maximum price per participant offered by DYCD.

5. **DOE Summer School “Wrap Around”:** On Page 15, footnote (a) “Program hours” beneath Chart #1 and on Page 24, the subsections “Elementary school programs” and “Middle school programs” beneath the first bullet “Duration/Hours of Operation (Service Option I)” are revised to provide additional language, as follows:

Under Option I, participants enrolled in the summer component of an OST elementary- or middle-school level program may attend a Department of Education (DOE) summer school program. For such participants, there will be no reduction in the maximum price per participant paid by DYCD and the time they are scheduled to attend summer school will qualify toward meeting the OST minimum hourly requirements. For reporting purposes, such participants’ daily attendance will be determined based on their participation in the OST program activities that take place following summer school sessions.

6. Option I Weekend Services for Elementary-Level School-Year Programs: On Page 15, footnote (a) “Program hours” beneath Chart #1 and on Page 24, the subsection “Elementary school programs” beneath the first bullet “Duration/Hours of Operation (Service Option I)” are revised to provide additional language, as follows:

Proposers unable to meet the schedule(s) for Option I elementary-level OST programs prescribed in the RFP due to religious observance may make up the time on another day in that week, as long as the total number of hours for the subject week equals the minimum required hours. Similarly, contractors unable to meet the Option I elementary-level schedule(s) prescribed in the RFP due to the target populations’ enrollment in a charter school or other school with an extended day schedule (e.g., school closing is 4:00 p.m.) may make up the time on another day in that week, as long as the total number of hours for the subject week equals the minimum required hours. In these circumstances, proposers may propose to make up the requisite time by offering programs on Saturdays and/or Sundays.

On Page 32, the 1st paragraph under the section “Program Activities” is revised to add additional language, as follows:

If the proposed program is for an Option I elementary-school level program that will be provided on Saturdays and/or Sundays, indicate weekend activities on the schedule (Attachment 2) and describe the need for this schedule in the proposal narrative.

7. Option I “Reduced” Hours for Elementary-Level School-Year Programs: On Page 15, footnote (a) “Program hours” beneath Chart #1 and on Page 24, the subsection “Elementary school programs” beneath the first bullet “Duration/Hours of Operation (Service Option I)” are further revised to provide additional language, as follows:

In the case of an Option I elementary-level school-year program, DYCD will consider proposals to serve participants for “reduced hours” of no fewer than 370 hours (i.e., 50 percent of the hours required for a full elementary-level school-year program under Option I of the RFP) during the school year. Such “reduced hours” programs may, but are not required to, offer participants OST services on the 20 “school closing” days referenced above. For such proposals, the maximum price per participant is reduced proportionately.

On Page 32, the 1st paragraph under the section “Program Activities” is further revised to provide additional language, as follows:

If the proposed program is a “reduced hours” Option I program provide a justification for reduced hours based on religious observances and/or the provision of services to target population(s) that attend schools such as religious schools and/or charter schools with extended day schedules (e.g., school closing is 4:00 p.m.) and/or schools that do not follow the public school calendar with respect to “school closing” days during the school year.

Proposers should note that revised Budget forms which must be utilized for elementary-level school-year programs proposing Option I - Reduced Hours are attached hereto. These forms will also be posted on DYCD’s website, www.nyc.gov/dycd.

8. Option I/High School Programs – Program Duration: On Page 15, Chart #1 Service Option I – Program Parameters is revised as follows with respect to the program hours of operation for high school-level programs. Pursuant to this revision, Option I high school-level programs must offer a minimum of 108 hours during the school year. The last row on Chart #1 on Page 15 of the RFP now reads as follows:

On Page 24, the subsection “High school programs” beneath the first bullet “Duration/Hours of Operation (Service Option I) is revised to read, as follows:

High school programs would operate for a minimum of 108 hours during the school year in out-of-school hours, including after school, in the evenings, and/or on weekends.

On Page 23, the first and fourth bullets under the sub-section labeled “For public-school-based programs” are deleted and replaced with the following language:

Except as further noted, the contractor would not be responsible for the opening fees and security coverage for OST programs located in public school buildings or facilities. However, the DOE will cover only the opening fees and security relating to high-school level programs that operate during after school hours (e.g., 3:00 to 6:00 p.m.) on days that school is in session. For Option I high-school level programs in public schools operating during evenings and on weekends, opening fees and security coverage must be paid for by the contractor and negotiated with the DOE before final contract award.

9. Facilities/Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Compliance: With respect to Options I, II, and III, the language on Page 22 and 36 under “Facilities” is revised as follows:

The program facility shall be easily accessible to public transportation. Pursuant to the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), the facility shall be accessible in accordance with the ADA Accessibility Guidelines for Buildings and Facilities, or appropriate alternative measures must be taken to ensure that services are accessible to persons with disabilities.

In Section III-2, Format and Content, on Page 31 the last two bulleted passages (beginning with “in the case that”) and in Section IV-2, Format and Content, on Page 44 the last bulleted passage under “Program Facility” (beginning with “state whether or not”) are deleted and replaced by the following language:

State whether or not the facility is accessible in accordance with the ADA Accessibility Guidelines for Buildings and Facilities; if not, describe how the proposer will make services accessible to persons with disabilities.

10. DYCD Web Site: On Page 5, the website address listed on the bottom of the Page 5 is incorrect. The correct website address is: www.nyc.gov/dycd.

11. Proposal Package Contents (“Checklists”): On Pages 34 and 46 under the “Price Proposal” bullet the item labeled “Letter(s) of Intent.” is deleted; on Pages 56 and 67, the item labeled “Letter(s) of Intent” is revised to read “Letter(s) of Intent, if applicable”. On Pages 34 and 45, under the “Program Proposal” bullet the items “*Letters of Support*” and “*Organization Chart*” are added after the item “Resumes and/or Description of Qualifications for Key Staff Positions.”

12. Option III, Parks and Recreation/ Duration/Hours of Operation: On Page 38, the language under the first bullet, “Duration/Hours of Operation” is deleted and replaced with the following language:

The programs under Service Option III would operate for 36 weeks during the school year, as follows:

Program Type 1 (Reach):

- *2 week days, 2 hours per day after school*
- *Weekends, 6 hours*

Program Types 2 (Academic Support) and 3 (Life Skills):

- *Programs serving youth 6-13 years of age:*
- *2 week days, 3 hours per day after school*

Programs serving youth 14-21 years of age:

- *2 week days, 2 hours per day after school*

Proposers unable to meet the above prescribed schedule(s) due to religious observance may make up the time on another day in that week, as long as the total number of hours for the subject week equals the minimum required hours.

On Page 44, the 1st paragraph under the section “Program Activities” is revised to add additional language, as follows:

If the proposed program is for Program Type 2 or 3 and will be provided on Saturdays and/or Sundays, indicate weekend activities on the schedule (Attachment 2) and describe the need for this schedule in the proposal narrative.

13. Appendix E-1/Pre-certified School Sites: Appendix E, the list of “pre-certified” DOE public schools available to host OST Option I and II programs, provided as Pages 94-106 of the OST RFP is replaced by the attached revised Appendix E. Proposers proposing to locate an OST

program at a pre-certified public school (see Program Facilities, Page 17 of the RFP) should ensure that the school they have selected is included on the revised list. (Note that OST programs may be located at schools that are not on the pre-certified list as long as a linkage agreement is submitted with the proposal. See Page 17 of the RFP.)

14. Appendix G/Synopsis of Youth Development Principles and Resources: On Page 117, in Appendix G, the first paragraph under “What is Positive Youth Development?” is deleted and replaced with the following language:

Positive youth development is an approach, a way to think about young people, that focuses on their assets (capacities, strengths, and developmental needs) and not solely on their deficits (risks, negative behaviors, and problems). This approach calls for shifting attention away from a crisis mentality that concentrates on stopping problems, to developing careful strategies that increase young people’s exposure to positive and constructive relationships and activities that promote healthy, responsible, and compassionate choices.

15. Appendix I/Options I and II - NYCHA Facilities: On Page 129, in Appendix I, the second sentence under “New York City Housing Authority” (beginning “Proposers may apply under...”) is revised as follows:

Provided they also meet the respective requirements of this RFP, proposers for Option I and Option II may propose to either (a) fully operate one of the listed NYCHA centers or (b) provide an OST Option I or II program within a NYCHA center.

Proposers for Options I and II may propose to provide services at a NYCHA facility not listed in Appendix I as long as a linkage agreement (Attachment 3 of the RFP) executed by an authorized NYCHA representative or their designee is submitted with the proposal. On Page 130 in Appendix I, NYCHA Community Center Sites the second column of the last row of the chart stating the address of the Williamsburg Center in Brooklyn is revised to read, “**195 Grand Avenue.**”

17. Proposal Summary Form (Attachment 1): Attachment 1, the Proposal Summary Form provided as Pages 134-144 of the OST RFP is replaced by the attached **revised** Attachment 1.

18. Budget Forms Instructions/Options I - III (Attachment 4): On Page 151 for Service Option I, Page 157 for Service Option II and Page 163 for Service Option III, the instructions pertaining to the personnel budget detail forms are revised to include the following additional language:

With regard to an employee who may work at more than one site or provide administrative support across multiple sites (e.g., a fiscal officer or an education director), proposers may include a percentage of such employee's salary in either the personnel section of the budget or as an indirect cost. If such an expense is included in the personnel section, list only the pro-rated portion that is applicable to the specific OST site as the annual salary. For example:

- *If a Fiscal Officer with an annual salary of \$50,000 will spend 5% of his/her time on the OST program, and the proposer wishes to include this expense in the personnel section of the budget, the annual salary should be listed as \$2,500 on the personnel detail (Page 2) section of the budget.*
- *If an Education Director, with an annual salary of \$40,000, will spend 100% of his/her time on the OST program but will divide his/her responsibilities among four sites, only the portion of the annual salary for work at a particular site should be reflected in the personnel detail (Page 2) section of the budget for that site. For example, if the Education Director will spend his/her time equally at each of the four sites, the annual salary would be listed as \$10,000 on the budget for each of the four sites.*

19. Budget Forms Instructions/Option IV (Attachment 4): The budget forms for Service Option IV- Technical Assistance provided as Page 167-169 of the OST RFP is replaced by the attached **revised** Pages 1-3.

B. CLARIFICATIONS TO THE RFP DOCUMENT

- 1. Accommodation of Voucher and Private Pay Youth:** A provider with the capacity to serve a greater number of youth than that contracted for under OST may accept voucher and private pay youth in the non-contracted slots; however, no OST participant may be charged a fee for services, and all participants must receive the same services.
- 2. Role of “Greater Consideration” in the Evaluation of OST Proposals:** The RFP cites a number of factors for which “greater consideration” will be given to proposals for Options I, II and/or III. (See Pages 11 through 16 of the OST RFP.) After calculation of technical scores and review of price per participant, the “greater consideration” factors will be considered, in conjunction with all of the factors cited in Section VII (C) - Basis for Contract Award on Page 68 of the RFP, as part of the final selection among proposers determined to be eligible for award. That is, proposals eligible for award that demonstrate one or more of the factors cited to receive “greater consideration” would have a greater chance of being selected for award than other proposals determined to be eligible for award that do not demonstrate such factors.
- 3. Target Zip Codes and “Greater Consideration”:** As stated on Page 16 of the RFP, proposals to provide OST programs in the zip codes identified as “target zip codes” in Appendix D will receive greater consideration. Please see above with regard to the meaning and application of “greater consideration”.

The OST RFP does not require proposers to serve the target zip codes in order to be eligible for funding. DYCD anticipates funding many OST programs in sites located in zip codes that are not target zip codes to ensure a geographically balanced distribution of programming.

In the chart of OST Target Zip Codes on Page 89 of Appendix D, under each DOE Region label, all of the zip codes listed (both those with and without asterisks) are target zip codes for Option I. To obtain greater consideration under Option II, proposals must propose to serve one of the asterisked zip codes.

- 4. Regulatory Framework/Applicability of New York State Child Care Regulations:** With reference to the New York State School-Age Child Care (SACC) regulations cited on Pages 20 and 35 of the RFP, programs that serve six or less children under the age of 13 are not subject to the SACC regulations.

Any program which does not have SACC registration should consult the definitions in 18 NYCRR 413.2 to determine if such registration is required. As referenced in the RFP, the regulations may be accessed at the State’s Web site at www.ocfs.state.ny.us/main/becs/daycare_regs.asp. DYCD’s Web site, www.nyc.gov/dycd also presents a link to this State Web site.

For additional information regarding the SACC regulations, the initial SACC application process, and application submission criteria, see the attached one-page fact sheet entitled “School-Age Child Care” provided by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DOHMH). Telephone inquiries may be directed to the DOHMH at the contact number listed on the fact sheet.

DYCD strongly encourages proposers to promptly apply for SACC registration through the Bureau of Day Care of the City’s Department of Health and Mental Hygiene. DYCD will not release funds to any contractor whose program is subject to the SACC regulations until SACC registration has been obtained.

5. Prohibition on Use of Other DYCD Funding. Proposers are prohibited from using other DYCD funds to supplement the OST funding.

6. Use of Other Public and Private Funds: Under Options I, II, and III, “greater consideration” will be given to proposals that offer additional funding (from sources other than DYCD) to supplement the DYCD funding. Such additional funds may be used to enhance OST programs. Similarly, OST funds may be used to enhance programs supported by funds from sources other than DYCD. For example, OST funds may be used to serve additional, unduplicated participants or to offer enhanced services to current participants of New York State Advantage After-School and 21st Century Community Learning Center programs. The OST proposal should specify how the OST funds will enhance a funded program.

7. School Closing Days and OST “Holidays”: On Pages 15-16, footnote (b) under Chart #1 states that OST providers of elementary and middle school year-round and school-year programs are expected to provide 10 hours of service on a total of 20 “school closing” days. “School closing” days are days on which public school is not in session. The required 20 “school closing” days on which OST services must be provided include the school closing days that fall within the DOE winter recess, the DOE midwinter recess, and the DOE spring recess, as well as additional school closing days chosen by the contractor from among the following: Rosh Hashanah (one or two days), Columbus Day, Election Day, Veterans Day, Yom Kippur (one or two days), and Good Friday.

Please note that for OST programs no coverage is anticipated on the following holidays, whether or not they fall within the school recesses itemized above: New Year’s Day; Martin Luther King Junior’s Birthday; President’s Day; Memorial Day; Independence Day; Thanksgiving Day; and Christmas Day.

8. SES Providers/OST Priority Middle Schools: In the case of an Option I OST program serving an OST Priority Middle School (pursuant to Appendix E-2) for which the SES provider loses State approval in Year 2 of the OST contract, the OST provider is required to find an alternative State-approved SES provider with which to partner.

9. Snacks/Meals: DOE will provide snacks or meals, as applicable, for participants of OST programs located at public schools **ONLY**. However, in the case of OST programs located at other than public schools, snack/meal costs are allowable expenses in the OST program budget. In addition, OST program participants may be eligible for subsidized meals and/or snacks through the federally subsidized Child and Adult Care Food Program, administered by the New York State’s Department of Health. For further information, call toll free number: 1-800-942-3858 (this number only works in NY), or go to www.health.state.ny.us/nysdoh/consumer/nutrition.htm.

10. Professional Development Costs: Professional development costs are allowable expenses in the OST program budget.

11. DOE Protocols Required for Option V – Evaluation: DYCD will work with DOE to obtain the required consent and approval for evaluation protocols relating to OST programs located in public schools, including survey administration and interviews. In addition, for all OST programs, parental consent for the “pre-“ and “post”-program surveys to be administered to participants will be obtained during program enrollment by OST direct service providers. The OST Evaluation Services provider will not be responsible for obtaining either parental or DOE consents to evaluation or survey administration.

12. Contract Value of Option V – Evaluation: The total value of the 40-month contract for OST Option V is up to \$1.5 million.

SCHOOL-AGE CHILD CARE

SCHOOL-AGE child care programs are subject to New York State Social Service Law 390 and regulations promulgated by the Office of Children and Family Services

NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS [18NYCRR PART 413.2(k)]:

School-age child care program means a program or facility which is not a residence in which child day care is provided to an enrolled group of seven or more children under 13 years of age, during the school year, before and or after the period such children are ordinarily in school or during school lunch periods. School-age child care programs also may provide care during school holidays and those periods of the year in which school is not in session, including summer vacation. Such programs must operate consistent with the local school calendar. The name, description or form of the entity, which operates a School-age child care program, does not affect its status as a School-age child care program.

Age of Children: a School-age child care program may provide care for School-age children of any age. If the program provides care for children over 13 years of age, the program must meet all regulatory standards in regard to such children just as if the children were under 13 years of age. No child may be admitted unless the child is enrolled in kindergarten or a higher grade or is at least six years of age. Children may receive care through the conclusion of high school.

Please note: The regulation requires that the program must include seven or more children under the age of 13. If the program has six or fewer children under the age of 13, it is not a School-age Child Care (SACC) program.

I. INITIAL SACC APPLICATION PROCESS:

2. All applications are mailed from Albany and will take 2-3 weeks to arrive.

II. APPLICATION SUBMISSION:

The following criteria must be met before a SACC registration will be issued:

1. The program director and all staff must be fingerprinted (fingerprint clearance may take up to 90 days).
2. A Certificate of Occupancy from the New York City Department of Buildings must be submitted.
3. A State Central Registry for Child Abuse and Maltreatment form must be submitted for each staff member so that they may be cleared for working with children.
4. The Bureau of Day Care must inspect the child care site before a registration will be issued.

All the required documentation must be submitted within 90 days after the submission of the first piece of such documentation. An applicant who fails to submit all documentation within the 90 days will be deemed to have withdrawn such application.
