OST Program Selections Announced

New York City's Department of Youth and Community Development (DYCD) has released a list of those "organizations determined eligible for award" of a new Out-of-School Time (OST) program contract. DYCD began contacting eligible agencies themselves yesterday. More than 550 separate OST program proposals from over 190 separate provider organizations were selected. In all, DYCD had received over 1,100 proposals to operate OST programs.

Providers and advocates were still sorting through the massive listing of eligible programs to determine how the selected proposals compare with existing programs operated under contracts for the Youth Development and Delinquency Prevention (YDDP), TASC and ACS school age child care programs.

The new programs are scheduled to open on September 1st.
