

Get Notified!



Receive notifications about emergencies via email, phone, text and Twitter.

Sign up now **FREE** for the City's Official Emergency Notification System at: nyc.gov, call 311 or follow @NotifyNYC

New York City has created a dedicated emergency notification office operating out of the Office of Emergency Management (OEM).

Notify NYC staff work in OEM Watch Command, where they constantly monitor emergency activity in New York City and the metropolitan area.

The goal for Notify NYC is to provide the information you want to receive, the way you want to receive it. Registration currently offers eight (8) notification types:

- **Emergency Alerts** – messages about life-threatening events that may require immediate action. All registrants are automatically added to this list.
- **Significant Event Notifications** – important information about emergency events, utility outages and other types of high-impact events in your area code.
- **Public Health Notifications** – information about important public health issues in your community.
- **Public School Closing/Delay Advisories** – updates about unscheduled public school closings, delays, and early dismissals.
- **Major Mass Transit Disruptions** – planned or unplanned disruptions to regular NYC Subway, Bus, and/or regional rail service, causing significant transit service delays in one or several boroughs of NYC.
- **Major Traffic Disruptions** – planned or unplanned arterial roadway closures, causing significant traffic delays on major highways, bridges and/or tunnels in one or several boroughs of NYC.
- **Unscheduled Parking Rules Suspensions** – updates about unscheduled suspensions of citywide parking rules.
- **Waterbody Advisories** – Combined Sewer Overflows (CSOs): issued when wastewater treatment plants or sewers get too full, usually after a major rain event or snowstorm, sending untreated wastewater into NYC waterways.

New York City Family Justice Centers



One-stop centers for domestic violence help

The New York City Family Justice Centers provide many criminal justice, civil legal, and social services in one location to victims/survivors of domestic violence, trafficking and elder abuse. Services include safety planning and risk assessment, counseling for victims and their children, civil legal assistance on immigration and family court matters, meeting with a prosecutor, accessing shelter, applying for housing and financial assistance, filing police reports, language interpretation, and a wide-range of self-sufficiency services including English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) classes, financial literacy and counseling, computer skills classes, and many other services.

Victims can meet with a prosecutor, speak with a trained counselor, and apply for housing and financial assistance in just one place. Children age 3 and up can play in a children's room while their parents receive services. Services are free and available to all victims. Victims can get help at the Centers no matter what their immigration status or the language they speak. Staff can speak more than 30 languages and interpretation services are also available in many more languages.
